Doris Mooar, was a member of the Green Township Senior Center for over 33 years. She joined the center in 1983, and she loved to tell the story about how she had to wait to join at the time because she wasn't old enough. Over the years she has lead the Vintage Artist, taught a class on writing memoirs and life stories, led Tai Chi, compiled books of poems and contributed to the book club. She passed away in March at the age of 99. She was well loved by all, especially the tight knit artist group. - “Doris was a jewel & she will forever shine in our memories. She was very intelligent and creative. We loved to hear her stories about life in Hazzard, KY, the beauty shop, how she met her husband Corky, insight about travel-

ing with the Ozzie Nelson band and the Ruth Lyons show (where Corky played in the band).” - Doña Neiheisel

- “We will always remember Doris’s smile & sunny disposition. Hearing her stories was a great treat.” - Margie & John DeHo
- “I always felt bad when I couldn’t attend her art sessions. She was a great leader.”- Frank Hardewig




